

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




## **THE OPERA**

Mascagni's comic opera tells the tale of a travelling commedia dell'arte troupe, their impresario, and the interaction between the players and the characters they play.

It's Mascagni's homage to Rossini and to the Italian opera buffa and commedia dell'arte traditions. It was premiered simultaneously in six Italian opera houses but, apart from Rome, the reception was subdued. While it has often been held that Mascagni was a 'one opera man' who could never repeat the success of Cavalleria rusticana, this verdict has already been debunked by Wexford's four previous Mascagni productions, most recently Guglielmo Ratcliff in 2015.

## THE PLOT

The title of Le Maschere refers to the masks of the commedia dell'arte and in the Prologue the players and their impresario present the characters they are about to play. These characters are: Brighella, a travelling salesman; Dr. Graziano, a man of law; Columbina, his maidservant (in love with Brighella); Pantalone a wealthy resident; his daughter Rosaura (in love with Florindo); a stuttering Tartaglia; Capitan Spaventa and his servant Arlecchino.

The remaining three acts are the play itself wherein after many vicissitudes, Florindo and Rosaura, aided by Columbina and Arlecchino, manage to prevent the marriage to the Capitan which Rosaura's father had planned for her and instead Pantalone agrees to the wedding of Rosaura and Florindo on the condition that in nine months a beautiful Pantaloncino will be born, while the opera ends with a joyful hymn to the Italian mask sung in chorus by all those present.

## **THE OPERA**

The Critic, or An Opera Rehearsed, is a comic opera set onstage during the final rehearsals of a new operatic work. It is a humorous take on the theatre and the people who inhabit it.

Both Stanford and Sheridan were born in Dublin but pursued their careers in England; Sheridan as a prominent playwright and one-time owner of the Theatre Royal Drury Lane and Stanford as Professor of Music at the Royal College of Music and the University of Cambridge as well as a composer best remembered for his choral works. The Critic was his third opera (of four) and considered one of his best, having been well received initially and later revived by Thomas Beecham.

# **THE PLOT**

The Critic takes place on the stage of a theatre, where a new opera, The Spanish Armada, is in rehearsal. The composer, Mr. Dangle and the librettist and impresario, Mr. Puff, have invited the eponymous critic, Mr. Sneer, to attend. Mr. Puff launches into a discussion of his profession, the theatre and the many merits of his new piece.

The rehearsal begins, and we are transported to the reign of Queen Elizabeth I. At Tilbury Fort, Sir Walter Raleigh and the Governor of the fort, Sir Christopher Hatton, discuss the threat of a Spanish invasion. They have captured the extravagant Don Ferolo Whiskerandos, son of the enemy admiral, and imprisoned him. (Throughout the rehearsal, Puff, Sneer and Dangle interrupt proceedings to comment on the work.) The governor's daughter Tilburina enters and we discover that she has fallen in love with Don Ferolo. Hatton's and Raleigh's nieces, both also in love with Whiskerandos, intent on avenging his faithlessness. They are prevented by an English sea captain. He kills Whiskerandos (in a scene that requires a lot of rehearsal) and the bereft Tilburina loses her mind.

An incongruous masque celebrating Queen Elizabeth's famous victory over the Spanish Armada concludes the opera, before Mr. Puff has to decide if they'll need more rehearsal tomorrow...

## **THE OPERA**

THE PLOT

A riotous spectacle and one of the wittiest operatic parodies of opera itself. A regional opera company faces numerous obstacles and much quarrelling as various singers threaten to walk out and chaos ensues.

The opera was originally a one-act farsa which premiered at the Teatro Nuovo in Naples in 1827, before Donizetti revised it as a two-act work with added recitatives and other material. Inspired by two comedies written by Antonio Simone Sografi between 1794 and 1816 it follows the theatrical traditions of Goldoni, Gozzi and Metastasio, subjecting the bad habits of the operatic world to biting criticism. Convenienze has appeared in a number of translations and under various titles such as Viva la Mamma and Viva la Diva.

Le convenienze ed inconvenienze teatrali (Conventions and Inconveniences of the Stage) is a two-act farce that shines an exaggerated spotlight on the behind-the-scenes working of a theatre and the rehearsal process, showing what can go wrong when the egos of the performers get in the way of putting on a good show. The title refers to the 'convenienze', which were the rules relating to the ranking of singers (primo, secondo, comprimario) in 19<sup>th</sup> century Italian opera and the number of scenes and arias that they were each entitled to expect.

A regional (and mediocre) opera company is producing a new work, but faces numerous obstacles. The Prima Donna acts every bit the diva and refuses to rehearse. The Tenor finds himself in the wrong production and quite out of his depth. The Seconda Donna's mother (played by a baritone) demands that her daughter be given a more prominent role, before deciding to take on several roles herself. Not be outshone, the Prima Donna's husband takes to the stage too. When the show eventually collapses and the company tries to flee under cover of night, rather than pay back all the investors (whose money has already been spent), the Impresario has other plans...

## **THE OPERA**

THE PLOT

It's easy from this distance to overlook the fact that Pagliacci was one of the earliest operas (along with Carmen and, of course, its fellow Cavalleria rusticana) to ennoble the feelings and emotions of their lowborn characters. But Pagliacci stands out especially for doing so while also making extremely sophisticated musical and dramatic points about theatrical illusion and reality.

Pagliacci is a dramatic tale of love and betrayal centred around a commedia dell'arte troupe. Canio and Nedda are married, and Nedda has a secret affair with Silvio.

Fearing Canio's jealous anger, Nedda hides the entanglement and even attempts to break it off with Silvio. Yet, their love is strong, and they plan to run away together. Tonio, also in love with Nedda, admits his love for her, but she turns him away, humiliating him. In an act of revenge, Tonio tells Canio that Nedda is having an affair, as he suspected. During a performance, Canio confronts Nedda and stabs her. Silvio attempts to save Nedda, running up on stage but is also stabbed by Canio. The audience, not realising the reality in front of them, claps until Canio screams, "the comedy is ended."

# POCKET OPERA opera beag

Art imitates life in a new dramatic work commissioned by WFO to commemorate the centenary of Puccini's death in 1924. Morris uncovered a complex web of infidelity and jealousy which almost destroyed the composer's career.

In the early days of his career, success came quickly for Giacomo Puccini.

La Bohème, Tosca and Madama

Butterfly were all created within less than eight years. He enjoyed the trappings of his new-found wealth and fame, shooting, sailing and fishing on the lake opposite his Tuscan mansion. One day, in 1909, disaster struck and his idyllic life began to unravel. Guilt-ridden and devastated by this terrible tragedy, Puccini searched for salvation in the only place he knew: by composing an opera that would finally set him free.



The novelist Colm Tóibín may need no introduction, but his deep love and appreciation of opera may still catch some unaware. There is nowhere better to make this discovery than in Wexford, since Tóibín's family had connections with the Festival from its very start.

Lady Gregory in America, Tóibín's third opera, reuniting him with the composer Alberto Caruso, reflects another of the author's literary fascinations. It's a portrait of Augusta Gregory, the redoubtable Irishwoman who as founder (together with Y.B. Yeats) of Dublin's Abbey Theatre was so hugely influential in shaping Irish cultural history. His operatic comedy follows her American adventures with other revolutionary Irish women.

# TRAVELLING BY CAR FROM DUBLIN AIRPORT/DUBLIN

Wexford Town is a two-hour drive from Dublin Airport. If you are travelling from Dublin Airport you can avoid Dublin city centre by two routes:

Route 1: Follow the M50 Southbound and join the M11 heading towards Wexford/Rosslare.

Route 2: Follow the signs for the City Centre and take the route for the Port Tunnel, follow signs for the East Link Bridge and the M11.

Continue on the M11, and at the Gorey bypass you can choose to stay on the M11 and travel through Oylegate to Wexford via Ferrycarrig Bridge, or you can take Exit 23 to R741 and follow the signs for Ballycanew, and this route will bring you into Wexford Town via Wexford Bridge.

Travel options to Wexford from Dublin Airport include car hire, train (irishrail.ie) and express coach (buseireann.ie and wexfordbus.com).
